We have raised awareness and informed our employees in relation to these issues. All new employees are educated in the Act through the induction process and their role in terms of identifying any potential breaches. Training focuses on recognising the signs of exploitation, ethical recruitment, and how to report concerns safely through understanding our whistleblowing policy.

SUPPLY CHAIN COMPLIANCE

Fraikin Ltd is committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chain or in any other part of our business. We have a zero-tolerance stance towards modern slavery and human trafficking. To ensure that all participants in our supply chain respect our values, we operate in accordance with the principles of responsible sourcing, particularly regarding the Supplier onboarding process.

DUE DILIGENCE

We monitor our suppliers through risk assessments and audit reviews, where we will confirm their commitment to ensuring their business is free of slavery. Our compliance team strives to ensure that these principles are observed through a continuous improvement approach that aligns with our ISO management review and Compliance reporting processes.
